AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP FAQs

Where and when is the scholarship application to be turned in?

ALA scholarships should be submitted by March 1 every year to a local American Legion Auxiliary unit.

What happens to my scholarship application after I submit it to my local American Legion Auxiliary unit?

If your application is selected by the unit as its winning

entry, it then moves on to be judged at the state level. If the application is selected there, the entry is then submitted to the national Auxiliary division for judging.

How do I find out if I am a scholarship recipient? All scholarship recipients will be notified via postal mail by May 15. Winners' names will also be posted on the national website at www.ALAforVeterans.org.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

CHILDREN OF WARRIORS NATIONAL PRESIDENTS' SCHOLARSHIP

Many of America's 1.9 million children of warriors are in need of financial assistance to further their education. The American Legion Auxiliary offers five \$3,500, five \$3,000, and five \$2,500 scholarships to high school students who are direct descendants of U.S. wartime veterans. SPIRIT OF YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS

Five scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 each are awarded annually to Junior members of the American Legion Auxiliary. Current ALA Junior members who are in high school and who have been Junior members for the past three years are eligible to apply. Visit www.ALAforVeterans.org for more information.

NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship helps people who are part of The American Legion Family pursue a college degree later in life or allow them to pick up where they left off when their studies were interrupted. Five scholarships in the amount of \$2,000 each are awarded annually.

DEPARTMENT AND LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Additional scholarships are offered in each ALA department (state) and through many

local ALA units and Legion posts. More than \$1 million is awarded every year. The amount, deadlines, and qualifications vary; contact the local American Legion Auxiliary unit in your



area for more information.

JAMES H. PARKE MEMORIAL YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship of up to \$20,000 is awarded to a deserving high school student who has volunteered at least 100 hours in the Veterans Affairs healthcare system during the past year. This scholarship is awarded annually at the VA Voluntary Service (VAVS) meeting in the spring. The Auxiliary contributes \$2,000 annually toward this scholarship. SAMSUNG SCHOLARSHIPS

ALA Girls State and American Legion Boys State citizens who are direct descendants of wartime veterans have the opportunity to apply for this scholarship. More than a quarter million dollars is

THE AMERICAN LEGION LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to high school seniors or graduates whose parent(s) were active-duty military, Guard, and Reserve personnel who were federalized and died while serving our country on or after September 11, 2001. Visit www.legion.org for details.

EAGLE SCOUT OF THE YEAR AWARD

One \$10,000 and three \$2,500 scholarships are awarded to outstanding Eagle Scouts. Visit **www.legion.org** for more information.

LEGION BASEBALL SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships based on leadership and sportsmanship are awarded to selected participants in The American Legion Baseball program.

ORATORICAL CONTEST

The national Oratorical Contest winner receives an \$18,000 scholarship. Second place receives \$16,000, and third place receives \$14,000. State winners receive a \$1,500 scholarship. High school students are eligible to compete, and local deadlines vary. Competition begins at the local post level and advances to a state competition.
